



### Presentation and Voting on the Division Budget

A New Budget Category has been Added

Included in this newsletter is the proposed budget for Division 91 for the fiscal year July 1, 2022 to June 30, 2023. We are asking for approval of the budget by the membership. Silence on the part of members would indicate acceptance of the budget. Negative votes are to be sent in writing to Gene Amaral, Treasurer and Budget Committee Chair. If you feel the budget is not acceptable, please send your negative vote in writing with an explanation of your concern to the chair at <a href="mailto:geneamaral7@gmail.com">geneamaral7@gmail.com</a> or by regular mail to him at 2462 Shield Dr., Union City, 94587. You will receive a response from him also in writing. Questions and comments about the proposed budget are also welcome.

If a majority of the membership casts negative votes the Budget Committee will revise the current budget using the concerns expressed by the negative votes as guides for the revisions. Remember, silence on part of a member indicates approval of the proposed budget. Negative votes must be received by November 1.

#### The New Category.

We have added a new category to the budget. We now plan to possibly transfer funds from the checking account to the grants account at the beginning of each fiscal year. The amount transferred will depend upon funds available in the checking account. The transfer this year was \$3,000. Since the checking account had a balance of over \$26,000, it was decided that a very generous transfer of \$3,000 was easily possible to the grants fund as the classroom grants program is a key indicator of our organization's interest in public education. Again, the amount transferred each year will be dependent upon funds available. It is possible that NO FUNDS be transferred in future years. The decision will be made by the Budget Committee with input and approval of the governing board.

## **VOLUNTEER HOURS**From Judy Molander

2020 and 2021 Covid controlled years were most unusual. For the volunteer hours of those years, I asked you to check your old calendars and make estimates for how you volunteered. Many of the activities that we did were no longer available due to restrictions; other new ways of volunteering were presented.

Only 22 members submitted hours for 2020 and 2021 combined. During those two years, 18,422 hours were donated. I know some of the people that send in information and nobody gave himself or herself enough credit. Be honest but remember anything you do that benefits another (including animals when you volunteer for animal services, taking care of neighbor's dog while they are on vacation etc.) and you do not receive pay or reimbursement counts as volunteer hours.

The hours that you submit are totaled with the other members of Division 91 and submitted to Area 4 which forwards them to the state office. Your name will never be used; your reporting is totally anonymous. The information is used for publicity in local and state areas and for legislative purposes. In 2017, over 2 million hours that was valued at \$55 million was donated as volunteer hours by retired teachers.

The form that was included in the last issue of FUN Times was intended as a worksheet for you to use this year. Another copy of that form is on the next page, and will be in the December issue of FUN Times and you may use that form to send in your 2022 hours in January, 2023.

## **Cairta Book Club News**



Why train with MFMII to become a volunteer Music Docent?


- 1. Discover and learn how to share your love of music with children in need

- \*Many preventive services (screenings, shots or vaccines, and yearly "Wellness" visits)



The cost of prescription drugs (including many recommended shots or vaccines).

Plans that offer Medicare drug coverage (Part D) are run by private insurance companies that follow rules set by Medicare.


Medicare & You 2023 explains the parts of Original Medicare and Medicare Advantage (also known as Part C).

**Open enrollment for Medicare** may be held at different times of the year. During the Covid Pandemic, open enrollment times were extended.

For those who have continued with their former school districts for their health insurance needs, open

enrollment takes place each fall. As written on the internet, open enrollment for Medicare for 2023 for CalPERS (and STRS members if they are included with their former school district) will be September 19, 2022 to October 4, 2022.

For Covered California (nationally known as the Affordable Care Act or "Obamacare"), open enrollment will be November 1, 2023 to January 31, 2023.


