Milestone Victory: Discharge Petition Reaches 218 Signatures for HR 82

As the President of the California Retired Teachers Association (CalRTA), I am thrilled to share the historic news that today, Thursday, September 19, the discharge petition for H.R. 82 has officially reached the 218 signatures needed. This marks a significant step forward in our fight to repeal the Windfall Elimination Provision (WEP) and Government Pension Offset (GPO).

The petition is now locked—no further signatures can be added or removed. Starting tomorrow, it will sit for seven legislative days, after which the bill will

proceed to the next steps. Speaker Johnson will have two days to schedule a hearing, marking the first time in history that a bipartisan bill of this nature, with a record-breaking 327 cosponsors, has reached this stage.

I want to express my deepest gratitude to Congressman Graves and Congresswoman Spanberger and all the California Congress members who have supported HR 82 as cosponsors. Although some were eager to sign the petition today, they missed the opportunity before it was locked. However, their commitment to this cause has been unwavering, and we thank them for their continued support.

This victory is the result of tireless efforts of Congressman Graves, Congresswoman Spanberger and each and every one of you who responded to legislative alerts, contacted your elected officials, and refused to give up.

CalRTA uses the Advocacy Platform to direct our advocacy efforts on issues important to our members. A new platform is being developed for 2025-2026. Members were emailed a survey August 26 and another email will go out October 1 asking you to prioritize issues on CalSTRS Retirement, Social Security/Federal Issues, Health Care/Healthy Aging, and Public Education Funding.

and the children cheer when you enter their classroom 1/2 hr. a week for musical fun and enrichment. Come feed your brain and touch your heart with music!



MEDICARE AND YOU 2024

October, 2024, those over 65 years old will be receiving the 2025 edition of the new Medicare and You 2025. This is "the official U. S. government Medicare handbook". Medicare health coverage for those age 65 and over is comprised of:

"Part A (Hospital Insurance)

- -Inpatient care in hospitals
- -Skilled nursing care
- -Hospice care
- -Home health care

Part B (Hospital Insurance) Helps cover:

- -Services from doctors and other health care providers
- -Outpatient care
- -Home health care




-Durable medical equipment (wheelchairs, walkers, hospital beds, and other equipment

-Many preventative services (screenings, shots or vaccines, and yearly "wellness" visits) Part D (Drug coverage)

-Helps cover the cost of prescription drugs (including many recommended shots or vaccines)

-Plans that offer Medicare drug coverage (Part D) are run by private insurance companies that follows rules set by Medicare



Open Enrollment for Medicare may be held at different times of the year. For those who have continued with their former school districts for their health insurance needs, open enrollment tales place each fall. Open enrollment for Medicare 2025 for CalPERS (and STRS members if they are included with their former school districts) will be September 16, 2024, to October 11, 2024.

For Covered California (nationally known as Affordable Care Act, "Obamacare", or Market-Place Plans).

open enrollment begins November 11, 2024. At this time, one may enroll in, renew, or change plans. December 15, 2024, is the last day to enroll, renew, or make changes to have insurance begin January 1. 2025.

Living in the Northern California area, our guidelines for making choices as to which companies to choose are outlined at the back of our edition of MEDICARE AND YOU 2024. By using MEDICARE AND YOU, section 11, you will find you will be able to compare health plans available in our Northern California area.
